- 1) Recognition of most exceptional chapters for outstanding community service and province philanthropy goals will be given as follows:
 - a. **Vice Satrap Award for Community Service Excellence** will be awarded to the chapter that presents outstanding dedication and participation in overall community and professional services during the academic year. Information will be collected from the Chapter of the Year form as well as submission to the Vice Satrap reporting all events completed every quarter/semester including a description and the percent of brothers in your chapter involved. The Mask articles will also be reviewed by the Vice Satrap to ensure that all events are compiled for making a final decision.
 - b. **Vice Satrap Award for Excellence in Province Philanthropy** will be awarded to a chapter that has shown outstanding dedication and service to our philanthropic focus chosen at the Province Assembly. This chapter also shows excellent communication with Vice Satrap in providing summaries in a timely matter manor. Information will be collected from the Chapter of the Year Form as well as submission of summaries to the Vice Satrap.
 - c. **Certificate of Recognition for participation in Province Philanthropy** will be awarded to all chapters having participated in the designated province philanthropy chosen by the delegation during Province Assembly. Brothers chosen by the chapter to be a liaison between the chapter and Vice Satrap should report a summary of events at intervals chosen by the Vice Satrap. Summaries will be used to determine participation in the province philanthropy.
- 2) The Province delegation will designate each year a Province Philanthropy project in which all chapters will be able to participate and dedicate services to throughout the academic year.
 - a. Philanthropic focus may include:
 - i. **Large organization** that provides services for chapter to participate. (i.e. Special Olympics, Big Brothers Big Sisters, Make A Wish Foundation, Habitat for Humanity, etc...)
 - ii. **Central Community Focus** providing chapters to determine the best community service within the province philanthropic focus. This will allow each chapter to dedicate services fully and not limit participation due to availability issues. (i.e. mission assistance, local charity, local hospital involvement, etc...)
 - iii. **Disease State Interventions** allowing chapters to participate in community and professional services within the college of pharmacy and surrounding community throughout the year. Chapters can be creative in programming and assisting with pre-arranged programs within the community. (i.e. AIDS-awareness, Breast cancer awareness, Diabetes clinics and education, etc...)

- b. Upon thorough evaluation and assessment by the Vice Satrap, philanthropies that lack opportunity for chapter participation will be addressed as follows:
 - i. Chapters may elect to raise money for the Province Philanthropy, sending donations to the Province Vice Satrap during the course of the year.
 - ii. Chapters should always be encouraged to continue additional community service projects voted on by the chapter.
- 3) Prior to establishing a Province Philanthropy at Assembly:
 - a. Nominations for philanthropic focus should be submitted to the Philanthropy Committee prior to the Saturday meeting during Province weekend to allow for inclusion on the agenda.
 - b. Chapters or brothers that have nominated a philanthropic consideration should be prepared to provide a brief, oral presentation (2-3 minutes in length) about the chosen philanthropy to the assembly to facilitate a proper vote.
 - c. Chapters or brothers should research topic thoroughly and include pertinent information to the delegation, including but not limited to:
 - i. Locations available
 - ii. How chapters can get involved
 - iii. Programs available from organization or intervention
 - iv. Mission of the organization and description of services requested
 - v. Approximate amount of time needed to fulfill philanthropic obligations
 - vi. Links and information on philanthropy
 - vii. Provide a brief ½ -1 page typed summary of the presentation to all delegates and officers prior to the Saturday afternoon meeting.
